



The main trailhead with new restrooms on 10-mile Road provides easy access. It's also accessible from the old south trailhead on Kies Street. It offers more than 9 miles of trails with one main loop connecting five individual loops. Each loop is designed for a different level of skill, with easier beginner trails (blue, green) and tighter, steeper advanced trails (yellow, orange, red, black) that include log crossings and rock gardens. All trails operate in a counter-clockwise direction. Cyclists must yield to foot traffic.

Luton Park is a nature preserve operated by Kent County Parks. The trail system travels through shady woodlands, marshes and meadows, and crisscrosses a ravine over Rum Creek. The trails were built and are maintained by the West Michigan Mountain Biking Alliance.

The north trailhead is easy to find. From US-131, north of Grand Rapids, take the 10-Mile Road/Rockford exit and travel 11 miles east on 10-Mile Road through Rockford to the trailhead entrance about a couple miles east of the Rockford city limits.
