

Middleville

The trail's origins date back to 1990 when the Michigan Central Railroad sold major portions of its right-of-way to the State of Michigan, the Rails-to-Trails Conservancy, the Thornapple Trail Association and several private landowners. The 42-mile nonmotorized trail is being built in phases and will eventually connect Grand Rapids with Vermontville.

Fully developed paved sections of the trail currently include 12.8 miles from Kentwood to 108th Street, 4.6 miles through Middleville to Irving, the 2.4-mile Hastings Riverwalk (see next page), and 1.5 miles from Maple Valley High School near Nashville to Vermontville.


